



## T4EU Summer School for Refugee Researchers and Scholars at Risk, Sofia 01-06.09.2025 (T 5.5)

### General Description

The **target group** for this training is:

- Refugee researchers and
- Scholars at risk.

They could be at any stage of the academic career:

- PhD student,
- Post Doc,
- Experienced researchers.

**Number** of participants: 30

The event is envisaged for 30 participants. Each university sends up to 3 refugee researchers. They are identified internally depending on own criteria, incl. on first come first take basis.

**Length:** 4 full days training

**Attendance** of sessions: Although in the format of a Summer School, this activity could be characterized more likely as a training program. The program is based on several main points steaming from EURAXESS network 10 years experience in supporting refugee researchers and exploring their needs. The workshops are envisaged to be interactive and practice oriented. They are structured in a logical flow. In this regard it is required that the participants attend all of them.



## Objective of the Summer School

The main objective is to improve the **integration of the participants in the European labor market**. As a result of the forced mobility that refugee researchers and researchers at risk experience they are not well prepared to deal with local cultures, local research systems and local labor market for highly qualified specialists. Generally most of them were mainly university lecturers in their countries and in most of the cases they will not be able to enter the local teaching process (at least not very soon if at all) in the universities due to the local regulations and high competitiveness of the university positions. Something more many of them has psychological traumas that need specialized treatment. In this situation they need extensive support to integrate and become the active side in the process.

The training program is built on mixed approach using presentations, discussions, group and individual work and networking activities. It is constructed small 1.5 hour workshops and includes all main topics related to overcoming the difficulties and improving their soft skills. The facilitators of the workshops will be mixed experienced practitioners and members of the alliance universities.

## Outcome

By attending and active working during the event the participants will learn about or be able to:

- Communicate with different audience in a foreign country,
- Identify symptoms of psychological trauma,
- Collaborate in international teams,
- Identify, evaluate and solve problems,
- Research funding opportunities in European context,
- Apply for funding or for a job.
